NextMove (ex-Mov'eo) is a French Automotive & Mobility cluster located in Paris region and Normandy, gathering 600+ members (SME's, Large Companies, Research Organisations, Universities, Technology Centres, other Ecosystem Actors). Our objective: Build the "Mobility Valley", a European and International reference of innovative and responsible mobility for the future.

Since it was created, NextMove has registered more than 500 R&I projects involving 1500 partners. Research activities are managed within four thematic

fields corresponding to the major challenges the automotive and mobility industry is facing:

- Safe, connected, and autonomous mobility
- ▲ Mobility with low environmental footprint
- New services and mobility solutions
- Industrial and operational excellence.

Working groups and services

Follow-up on working groups

EACN disposes about five working groups aiming at allowing the exchange and discussion of topics such as industry 4.0/digitalisation/industrial modernisation, supply chain, skills & competencies, mobility, or clean, connected, and autonomous vehicles. The last months have shown that some of the working groups have difficulties to mobilise sufficient participants as these activities are often 'add-on' activities to the daily business. Thus, the Executive Board decided to focus in the future on two future-oriented working groups: Mobility and Clean, connected, and autonomous vehicles.

OEM Disruption Information Service

Even though the service is operational, and that we see a huge added-value in it for our members, it turns out that getting valuable information sufficiently early is very difficult or even impossible, even with the close contacts clusters have with their OEMs and Tier-1. This leads to a situation where the corresponding website does almost never show information, reducing its attractiveness. It has therefore been decided to take the service of the website for external visitors.

Project corner

EVOLUTE Kick-off Meeting in Heilbronn, Germany - 28 – 29th March 2022

The Project EVOLUTE, which is co-funded by the EU COSME-programme with 500,000 Euro, started its work in February 2022. At the end of March, all



six cluster members from five different countries came together for a Face-to-Face Kick-off Meeting in Heilbronn, Germany. The event was hosted by the leader of the project DIALOG by Wirtschaftsförderung Raum Heilbronn GmbH.

EVOLUTE stands for: wE striVe fOr cLUsTer Excellence in the Automotive and Land Machine Industry. The target of Cluster Excellence is to become highly efficient so-called "High Performance" Clusters to establish new services for the cluster members to support companies during the transformation of the industry. The consortium brings together six European cluster organisations: Wirtschaftsförderung Raum Heilbronn GmbH (Germany – Coordinator), Asociacion Cluster de Automocion de Aragon (Spain), Cluster de la Maquinaria i dels Medis De Produccio Agricola de Catalunya (Spain), Automobilski Klaster Srbije (Serbia), COMET – Cluster Metalmeccanica Friuli Venezia Giulia (Italy) and Moravskoslezsky Automobilovy Klastr (Czech Republic).

At the Kick-off meeting all participants were working towards one common vision and strategy. Discussion topics were trends from the Automotive and Land Machine Industry, factors for the Cluster Performance Analysis as basis for the benchmarking and strategy. A learning workshop with an ESCA (European Secretariat for Cluster Analysis)-manager was also held. The members were visiting a local supplier for both the Automotive and Land Machine industry and could therefore gain some insights into local challenges.



The team is now focusing on the "Cluster Xchange", which supports European industrial clusters and their members - especially SMEs - strengthening their strategic cross-regional collaboration activities by spending periods of time in a partner cluster (or SME/scaling-up support organisation member of a cluster) in another COSME participating country. Those short-term exchanges will be used to learn from counterparts, explore growth opportunities in new markets, take up new technologies, digitalization and green low-carbon solutions or invest in strategic interregional collaboration. The exchanges are funded through a lumpsum.

Funding opportunity for the innovation of the European light weighting SMEs

The Advanced Materials & Manufacturing United for **LightwEighT** (AMULET) project



launched the 1st AMULET Open Call on 12th April 2022. Project partner, including EACN member autoklastr (CZ), aim at supporting the creation of new value chains by fostering the penetration of advanced lightweight materials in industry. AMULET focuses on three advanced materials: light metal alloys, ceramic matrix composites, polymer-based composites, and their implementation in four sectors:



In the 1st call, AMULET will select up to 36 projects invited to a Jury Day, from which up to 26 will pass to the AMULET programme support services, and out of them, up to 7 will complete the full programme. Deadline for application: 30 June 2022.

Automotive Skills Alliance becomes a nonprofit organisation

The Automotive Skills Alliance (ASA) organised a Partnership Meeting on 5 May 2022 and



presented achievements and future steps.

Since January 2022, ASA is a legal non-profit organization with a Bord of Directors (President and two Vice-presidents) and an ASA Advisory Board. The Board is supported by the ASA WG leaders, the daily work is ensured by the ASA Office. Creating the legal structure enables ASA to become full partner in EUfunded projects to steer and push its activities. The new organisation makes it necessary to shift the 90 partners to members, a membership fee helps paying daily activities and requested co-financing in, e.g., EU-Projects.

ASA aims at building a European-wide up-/reskilling alliance for the automotive (and mobility) sector with a strong focus on regional implementation. ASA is structured around four Working Groups: #1 Horizontal Issues, #2 Communication & Dissemination, #3 Skills Intelligence (with several subgroups), and #4 Regional Implementation. ASA develops and offers tools such as the ASA Learning Platform, the ASA EU-wide Database, an ASA Library, an ASA Academy, or the ASA Skills Intelligence platform.

EACN itself as well as the following EACN members are currently supporting ASA: EACN, AVIA, CAAR, CEAGA, CIAC, EAA, FACYL, Mobinov.
